Paradox Sports Returns to North Conway for Third Annual Adaptive Ice Climbing Event

Boulder, CO – Paradox Sports is pleased to announce that the third annual Paradox Ice event in North Conway, N.H. on Feb. 7 – 10. Throughout the weekend, 20 adaptive athletes will learn about the specialized equipment and adaptive techniques needed to climb vertical walls of ice.

Participants range from military veterans with PTSD to amputees and the visually impaired. Registration includes meals, lodging, equipment rentals and guide services.

"We're excited to bring Paradox Sports adaptive climbing programs to the North East. This is the only event of its kind in the region and the community really comes together to support us and our athletes," said Nate McKenzie, Program Coordinator for this year's event.

A community night fundraiser will be held on Saturday, Feb. 8 at the Eastern Slope Inn. Keynote speaker Mark Synnott, an AMGA Rock and Alpine certified guide, and a long time member of The North Face Climbing Team, will present, followed by a short film screening and gear raffle. Admission is free and open to the general public.

Co-founder and below-the-knee amputee, Malcolm Daly, launched Paradox Ice in 2008: "Ice is the great equalizer. None of us can climb it without adaptive equipment. We just go one step further."
